15(1) INTERNATIONAL AFFAIRS AND DEFENCE

- 15. (1) The head of a government institution may refuse to disclose any record requested under this Act that contains information the disclosure of which could reasonably be expected to be injurious to the conduct of international affairs, the defence of Canada or any state allied or associated with Canada or the detection, prevention or suppression of subversive or hostile activities, including, without restricting the generality of the foregoing, any such information
- (a) relating to military tactics or strategy, or relating to military exercises or operations undertaken in preparation for hostilities or in connection with the detection, prevention or suppression of subversive or hostile activities;
- (b) relating to the quantity, characteristics, capabilities or deployment of weapons or other defence equipment or of anything being designed, developed, produced or considered for use as weapons or other defence equipment;
- (c) relating to the characteristics, capabilities, performance, potential, deployment, functions or role of any defence establishment, of any military force, unit or personnel or of any organization or person responsible for the detection, prevention or suppression of subversive or hostile activities;
- (d) obtained or prepared for the purpose of intelligence relating to
 - i) the defence of Canada or any state allied or associated with Canada, or
 - ii) the detection, prevention or suppression of subversive or hostile activities;
- (e) obtained or prepared for the purpose of intelligence respecting foreign states, international organizations of states or citizens of foreign states used by the Government of Canada in the process of deliberation and consultation or in the conduct of international affairs:
- (f) on methods of, and scientific or technical equipment for, collecting, assessing or handling information referred to in paragraph (d) or (e) or on sources of such information;
- (g) on the positions adopted or to be adopted by the Government of Canada, governments of foreign states or international organizations of states for the purpose of present or future international negotiations:
- (h) that constitutes diplomatic correspondence exchanged with foreign states or international organizations of states or official correspondence exchanged with Canadian diplomatic missions or consular posts abroad; or
- (i) relating to the communications or cryptographic systems of Canada or foreign states used
 - i) for the conduct of international affairs,
 - ii) for the defence of Canada or any state allied or associated with Canada, or

iii) in relation to the detection, prevention or suppression of subversive or hostile activities.

19(1) PERSONAL INFORMATION

19. (1) Subject to subsection (2), the head of a government institution shall refuse to disclose any record requested under this Act that contains personal information as defined in section 3 of the Privacy Act.

20(1) THIRD PARTY INFORMATION

- 20. (1) Subject to this section, the head of a government institution shall refuse to disclose any record requested under this Act that contains
- (a) trade secrets of a third party;
- (b) financial, commercial, scientific or technical information that is confidential information supplied to a government institution by a third party and is treated consistently in a confidential manner by the third party;
- (c) information the disclosure of which could reasonably be expected to result in material financial loss or gain to, or could reasonably be expected to prejudice the competitive position of, a third party; or
- (d) information the disclosure of which could reasonably be expected to interfere with contractual or other negotiations of a third party.
- (2) The head of a government institution shall not, pursuant to subsection (1), refuse to disclose a part of a record if that part contains the results of product or environmental testing carried out by or on behalf of a government institution unless the testing was done as a service to a person, a group of persons or an organization other than a government institution and for a fee.
- (5) The head of a government institution may disclose any record that contains information described in subsection (1) with the consent of the third party to whom the information relates.
- (6) The head of a government institution may disclose any record requested under this Act, or any part thereof, that contains information described in paragraph (1)(b), (c) or (d) if that disclosure would be in the public interest as it relates to public health, public safety or protection of the environment and, if the public interest in disclosure clearly outweighs in importance any financial loss or gain to, prejudice to the competitive position of or interference with contractual or other negotiations of a third party. R.S. 1985, c. A-1, s.20.

21(1) OPERATIONS OF GOVERNMENT

Further to what I provided to David on our call just now, the following could be shared with ZAGRB HOM, if deemed helpful:

funding has also been targeted to facilitate other countries' substantive participation in international climate change negotiations within the UNFCCC,
to my knowledge, we have focussed our funding at strengthening local capacity in other countries, and nownot towards Canadian speakers making presentations abroad on the subject of climate change;
As general guidance we would want to ensure that climate-change related support provided through departmental funds, while helping to address the challenge of climate change in tangible ways —in particular in those countries most vulnerable to its effects (including Small Island Developing States)— also served to enhance Canada's profile in a positive way and

MDC had concerns that the funding proposed below would not be consistent with our interests and approach outlined above, and would in fact run counter to Canada's interests more broadly, so we indicated to GLB that we

would recommend against supporting.

Finally, while the funding Canada has provided within the context of Fast-Start Climate Financing, is of a different order of magnitude, I am enclosing for reference the 2-pager that was issued last fall, announcing the details of our \$400 million contribution in 2010-11.

I hope this is helpful.

Have you heard about Toronto-based artist and environmental activist, Franke James, and/or the organization(s) with which she is affiliated? If so, can you offer some advice on how to respond to the request below? It concerns a proposal to organize a series of outreach visits by Ms Franke to Eastern and Southeastern Europe, Italy and the Middle East for the purpose of "Raising Awareness on Climate Change through Artistic Expression" - targetting primarily, but not exclusively, youth in those regions.

We had received a request for a financial contribution from a Zagreb, Croatia-based organization called "Nektarina Non Profit" some 2 weeks ago, and a follow-up message one week later from our mission in ZAGRB. A second message below from ZAGRB arrived this morning. "Nektarina" describes itself as "an international non-profit organization dedicated to educating, connecting and inspiring people to care about their communities and their environment". They list as their partners the following NGOs:

Earth Day Network (www.earthday.org) , based in USA
 GCCA Global Campaign for Climate Action (www.gc-ca.org), based in Canada
 TCKTCKTCK (public face of GCCA / http://tcktcktck.org), based in Canada
 10:10 Global (www.1010global.org), based in UK

GCCA appears to be the most pertinent NGO - its secretariat is based in Montreal and has benefitted from Quebec Government support. It is also well-connected to other international NGOs, the most well-known of which are perhaps Greenpeace, WWF, Union of Concerned Scientists, OXFAM, Equiterre, US Climate Action Network and OIKOS/World Council of Churches.

The organizers of the proposed visit by Ms James sent their initial request to missions in several southern and attached proposed visit by Ms James sent their initial request to missions in several southern and eastern European countries, plus the Middle East, requesting \$10,000 per mission, although the budget in the attached proposal calls for individual budgets of \$34,000 per country. Personally, I'm sceptical for various reasons about providing financial support at this time. Nevertheless, I would not rule out future interest on our part, perhaps in different circumstances, and would like to discuss this matter with you or the appropriate officer in your section. Are you available for a conversation between now and 11:30 Ottawa time (17:30 Rome time), or some time tomorrow morning?

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CANADA – 2010 FAST-START CLIMATE CHANGE FINANCING

Canada's commitment to provide climate change financing reflects our support for the Copenhagen Accord, which represents a significant breakthrough in the global effort to address climate change.

As part of our commitment to provide our fair share of fast-start financing under the Copenhagen Accord, Canada is contributing \$400 million in new and additional climate change financing for the 2010-2011 fiscal year.

This financing will go towards supporting developing countries' efforts to reduce greenhouse gas emissions and adapt to the adverse impacts of climate change, with a focus on three priority areas – adaptation, clean energy, and forests and agriculture.

This investment of \$400 million represents Canada's largest ever contribution to support international efforts to address climate change. Combined with other committed contributions from the Government of Canada, the total amount of Canadian international public climate financing is projected to reach approximately \$441 million for the 2010/2011 fiscal year.

Canada is also contributing \$238.4 million over four years to the Global Environment Facility (GEF), the world's largest environmental fund, which marks an increase of 50% over Canada's contribution over the past four years. The additional \$18.5 million in annual financing will be drawn in 2010 from the \$400 million in fast-start financing.

ADAPTATION

Canada's fast-start financing for adaptation will go towards supporting the poorest and most vulnerable countries, including Least Developed Countries (LDCs), Small Island Developing States (SIDs), and countries in Africa. Our 2010/2011 adaptation financing package builds upon significant past contributions to adaptation efforts internationally, including our previous contribution of \$100 million to the World Bank's Pilot Program on Climate Resilience over 2008-2009.

- \$20 million will go to the Least Developed Countries Fund (LDCF) in support of urgent and priority adaptation needs of the poorest and most vulnerable countries in the world.
- ▶ \$10 million will go to the International Development Research Centre to build upon their innovative Climate Change Adaptation in Africa Program (CCAA). This support will be aimed at strengthening adaptation research centres in Africa.
- \$5 million will contribute to climate change adaptation

- initiatives in Haiti, working with current partners active in Haiti.
- ▶ \$7 million of Canada's fast-start financing will be added to bring Canada's total contribution to \$15 million in 2010/2011 for the world food program for adaptation and food security in Ethiopia. This builds upon the \$20 million that has already been committed over the past two years.
- \$3 million will support Vietnam's National Target Program on Climate Change.

CLEAN ENERGY

Canada will provide the International Finance Corporation (IFC), a member of the World Bank Group, with \$285.7 million to be used as concessional financing for a broad portfolio of clean energy projects in developing countries, as part of Canada's commitment to support mitigation efforts.

In addition, \$5.8 million will be provided as grant financing to support IFC's Advisory Services that will help remove barriers to private clean energy investment and build technical expertise. For example, advice will be provided to financial institutions in developing countries on how to improve energy efficiency and increase investments in renewable energy.

The investments are intended to leverage private financial flows for low-carbon investment and are aimed at getting a fast-start on the long-term financing goals in the Copenhagen Accord. Canada will work with the IFC to track the amount of private investment directly mobilized by Canadian public finance, as well as the emissions reductions achieved.

FORESTS


Reducing emissions from deforestation will lead to significant reductions in global greenhouse gas emissions and is a key priority outlined in the Copenhagen Accord.

\$40 million will go to the World Bank's Forest Carbon Partnership Facility's (FCPF) Readiness Fund which supports the building of national capacity to address deforestation and forest degradation in developing countries.

SMALL-SCALE PROJECTS AND ACTIVITIES

An additional \$5 million will be invested in small scale projects and activities in support of fast-start financing priorities, as well as to support participation by developing country representatives, particularly from LDCs, SIDS, and countries in Africa, in UNFCCC negotiations and related meetings and partnerships.

Thanks Jeremy, appreciate the detailed response. However we have not been asked to provide funding for this event, as I noted in my message, we have been asked only for "moral support" - given that part of the exhibition features a Canadian, who appears to work extensively on climate change education and outreach in a reasonably balanced way - through authorizing the use of the Canada wordmark on publicity materials (and we would drop in on the event of course to see how it is being run). This event is "consciousness- raising" on carbon reduction at a personal level for teens through the "10:10Teen" initiative. Nor are we being asked to provide funding for Ms. James participation as the organizers are bringing only 20 pieces of her artwork for the event (but in fact I would hope that PIF funding could be applied to support for a Canadian speaker on climate change/sustainable develoopment issues, if Of course one of our choice, given this is a type of event we would look at organizing normally in order to present Canadian positions to our contacts) It would appear to me the event itself falls easily into the GoCs approach as you have described, if peripheral to our priorities for funding. Given no draw on funds is being considered, my question was rather related to the general outlook on the issue presented by Ms. James. Grateful to know if this additional information affects your advice as to the association with the event. Perhaps I should have emphasized this detail in my first message. Sorry for any confusion.

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As general guidance we would want to ensure that climate-change related support provided through departmental funds, while helping to address the challenge of climate change in tangible ways —in particular in those countries most vulnerable to its effects (including Small Island Developing States)—

MDC has concerns that the funding proposed would not be consistent with our interests and approach outlined above, and would in fact run counter to Canada's interests more broadly.

While the funding Canada has provided within the context of Fast-Start Climate Financing, is of a different order of magnitude, I am enclosing for reference the 2-pager that was issued last fall, announcing the details of our \$400 million contribution in 2010-11.

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This financing will go towards supporting developing countries' efforts to reduce greenhouse gas emissions and adapt to the adverse impacts of climate change, with a focus on three priority areas – adaptation, clean energy, and forests and agriculture.

Canada will provide the International Finance Corporation (IFC), a member of the World Bank Group, with \$285.7 million to be used as concessional financing for a broad portfolio of clean energy projects in developing countries, as part of Canada's commitment to support mitigation efforts.

In addition, \$5.8 million will be provided as grant financing to support IFC's Advisory Services that will help remove barriers to private clean energy investment and build technical expertise. For example, advice will be provided to financial institutions in developing countries on how to improve energy efficiency and increase investments in renewable energy.


SMALL-SCALE PROJECTS AND ACTIVITIES

Une artiste qui dérange

Charles Côté

Le gouvernement canadien a tout fait pour saboter une exposition itinérante qui critique les orientations environnementales du pays, selon une artiste torontoise et son organisatrice européenne. Cela s'apparente à de la censure politique, selon deux experts.

Les illustrations de Franke James devaient faire le tour de l'Europe dans le cadre d'une série de forums jeunesse sur le thème de l'environnement. Mais, à moins d'un revirement inattendu, les oeuvres resteront chez l'artiste en banlieue de Toronto au lieu d'être suspendues à Berlin le 30 août.

Selon ce qu'affirment Mme James et l'organisatrice de son exposition, Sandra Antonovic, le ministère des Affaires étrangères et du Commerce international a torpillé le projet, en raison du caractère politique des oeuvres de Mme James.

Non seulement le réseau d'ambassades du Canada lui a fermé ses portes, alors qu'il appuie souvent des artistes canadiens, mais un commanditaire privé européen s'est retiré, apparemment après avoir subi des pressions, ce qui forcera l'annulation du projet.

"Cela aurait été ma plus grande exposition à ce jour, a dit Mme James à La Presse. C'est une grande déception. Cela me semble injuste que le gouvernement fasse obstacle à ma carrière."

L'appui des ambassades du pays d'origine de l'artiste est important quand on organise une exposition itinérante, sans même qu'il soit question d'argent. "Quand on cherche des commanditaires privés, ils demandent habituellement si l'artiste a l'appui de son pays d'origine", dit Mme Antonovic, jointe par La Presse à Zagreb.

Le Ministère a répondu ceci par courriel aux questions de La Presse: "Le financement n'a jamais été retiré, pas plus qu'il n'était garanti. Les missions canadiennes ont décidé, en fin de compte, de ne pas financer la tournée européenne de l'artiste."

La Presse a aussi demandé sur quels critères ces décisions étaient prises, mais n'a pas obtenu de réponse à ce sujet.

En outre, le Ministère nie, dans un courriel, être intervenu auprès du commanditaire privé de l'exposition.

"Ce n'est pas dans les pratiques du Ministère d'intervenir auprès des commanditaires privés d'artistes canadiens à l'étranger."

Mme James a obtenu succès et reconnaissance au cours des dernières années pour son travail sur le thème de l'environnement et des changements climatiques. Elle a publié un livre, réalisé un court métrage et participé à plusieurs conférences.

Mais il y a une oeuvre en particulier, intitulée Dear Prime Minister, qui lui a peut-être coûté très cher.

Dans cette série d'illustrations publiées pendant la campagne électorale de 2008, Mme James critique les orientations environnementales canadiennes. Elle demande à l'industrie des sables bitumineux de cesser de polluer. Elle donne son appui à une taxe sur le carbone pour lutter contre les changements climatiques, une idée défendue alors par le Parti libéral et le Parti vert mais rejetée par les conservateurs.

A l'époque, l'actuel ministre des Affaires étrangères, John Baird, était ministre de l'Environnement. Le ministre Baird a fait savoir à La Presse qu'il appuyait la version des faits avancée par son ministère.

"Oui, je critique certaines des orientations du gouvernement Harper, dit Mme James. Si c'est ma série Dear Prime Minister qui les a mis en colère, je peux savoir pourquoi. J'ai même parlé en faveur d'une taxe sur le carbone. Mais je ne l'ai pas fait pour les libéraux. Je l'ai fait parce que je me suis renseignée là-dessus et que le sujet me concerne comme citoyenne. Je n'ai jamais travaillé pour un parti politique."

L'idée d'une tournée européenne vient de l'organisme Nektarina, de Croatie. "Nous sommes une petite organisation active dans 30 pays en Europe centrale et de l'Est, dit Mme Antonovic, responsable de l'organisme. Nous travaillons avec un réseau de 5000 écoles et universités pour promouvoir l'éducation à l'environnement, créer des liens à ce sujet et inspirer les gens."

"On a vu le travail de Franke James pour la première fois en 2009 et nous savions que ce serait parfait pour accompagner une série de forums jeunesse que nous organisions", dit-elle.

Appui verbal

Elle dit avoir obtenu l'appui verbal de l'ambassade du Canada à Zagreb début mai, lors d'un déjeuner d'affaires. Appui qui lui a été retiré dans les jours qui ont suivi. "Il y a quelqu'un à Ottawa qui a dit qu'elle n'aurait pas d'appui parce qu'elle s'oppose publiquement au gouvernement canadien", dit Mme Antonovic.

Mme James n'a pas baissé les bras. Le 18 juin, elle a inscrit son entreprise au service de représentation commerciale du ministère des Affaires étrangères. Début juillet, une déléguée commerciale du Ministère à Toronto a pris son dossier en charge.

Mme James a ensuite écrit une lettre de présentation à cette déléguée commerciale. Cette missive mentionnait pour la première fois le nom d'un commanditaire privé de son exposition, la société d'assurance suisse Basler, qui fait aussi des affaires sous le nom Baloise.

Ce commanditaire s'était engagé à fournir 75 000\$ à Nektarina mais ne voulait pas être nommé publiquement.

Selon les courriels fournis par Mme James à La Presse, la déléguée commerciale a transmis cette lettre de présentation le vendredi 8 juillet à des ambassades concernées, avec un mot d'appui.

Mais cette démarche qui devait aider le projet d'exposition lui a apparemment porté un coup fatal. Le lundi suivant, le 11 juillet, l'assureur suisse a appelé Nektarina pour annuler sa commandite. Selon Mme Antonovic, l'entreprise a subi des pressions du gouvernement canadien. Ce que nie le gouvernement. "Nous n'avons aucune connaissance d'un présumé appel téléphonique entre un fonctionnaire du Ministère et le commanditaire non identifié de l'exposition de Mme James."

"Identité inconnue"

La Presse a demandé si cette réponse signifiait que personne au Ministère ne connaissait l'identité du commanditaire. "Je vous confirme que son identité nous est inconnue", a-t-on répondu.

Pourtant, selon copie de la correspondance par courriel entre Mme James et l'agente commerciale,

cette dernière savait de quelle entreprise il s'agissait depuis le 6 juillet. Le 8 juillet, elle a transmis cette information aux ambassades du Canada de Lettonie, Pologne, Russie, Serbie, Israël et Grèce ainsi qu'au consulat général du Canada à Barcelone.

La disparition de la commandite de Basler menace l'existence même de Nektarina. "Si nous n'obtenons pas d'autres financements, nous devrons fermer les portes fin septembre", dit Mme Antonovic.

L'organisatrice croate se dit "sidérée" devant l'attitude du gouvernement canadien dans ce dossier. "C'est le genre de réaction qu'on attendrait de la Chine, du gouvernement Poutine ou du Kazakhstan, dit-elle. On considère le Canada comme un symbole de la liberté d'expression, un pays ouvert, mais ce n'est pas le cas."

"Franke James n'est pas une extrémiste, elle ne fait que s'exprimer à travers son art."

ALLOCATION OF FUNDS

In agreement with the Embassy of Canada Zagreb, we allocated 2,200 CAD for projects in Croatia and 500 CAD for projects in Kosovo.

PROJECT FUNDED

Considering that Nektarina Non Profit partnership with Canadian based GCCA (Global Campaign for Climate Action), and the fact that Nektarina Non Profits serves as a hub for the global carbon reduction campaign 10:10 for which it created 10:10 Teen Project, a decision was made to use the donated funds for 10:10 Teen Project, both in Croatia and in Kosovo.

ABOUT THE PROJECT

Using social networks to inspire and engage youth towards positive action in reducing carbon footprint, 10:10 Teen Project creates a new way for young people to interact, express themselves and be creative all with a joint goal of reducing carbon emissions. 10:10 Teen Project targets teenagers, but is equally open to all who'd like to get involved. Participants are challenged with simple, yet educational bi-weekly tasks related to carbon reduction.

10:10 global campaign, already well established for its fun and positive approach in engaging people to take active part in reduction of greenhouse gas emissions, gets even more positive with newly launched 10:10 Teen Project. The project was created and launched by a regional 10:10 hub operating in countries of Central, Eastern and SouthEast Europe, Russia and Mediterranean. Hello Jeremy,

Have you heard about Toronto-based artist and environmental activist, Franke James, and/or the organization(s) with which she is affiliated? If so, can you offer some advice on how to respond to the request below? It concerns a proposal to organize a series of outreach visits by Ms Franke to Eastern and Southeastern Europe, Italy and the Middle East for the purpose of "Raising Awareness on Climate Change through Artistic Expression" - targetting primarily, but not exclusively, youth in those regions.

"Nektarina" describes itself as "an international non-profit organization dedicated to educating, connecting and inspiring people to care about their communities and their environment". I just had a useful discussion with David and had the opportunity to expand on the concerns related to the below. As I understand it, ZAGRB HOM would appreciate receiving a bit more background on the issue, which I am happy to provide.

Further to what I provided to David on our call just now, the following could be shared with ZAGRB HOM, if deemed helpful:

- funding has been provided to support climate-change related projects abroad to assist countries (in particular the most vulnerable) adapt to climate change;
- funding has also been targeted to facilitate other countries' substantive participation in international climate change negotiations within the UNFCCC,
- to my knowledge, we have focussed our funding at strengthening local capacity in other countries, and not/not towards Canadian speakers making presentations abroad on the subject of climate change;

As general guidance we would want to ensure that climate-change related support provided through departmental funds, while helping to address the challenge of climate change in tangible ways —in particular in those countries most vulnerable to its effects (including Small Island Developing States)—

MDC had concerns that the funding proposed below would not be consistent with our interests and approach outlined above, and would in fact run counter to Canada's interests more broadly, so we indicated to GLB that we would recommend against supporting.

Finally, while the funding Canada has provided within the context of Fast-Start Climate Financing, is of a different order of magnitude, I am enclosing for reference the 2-pager that was issued last fall, announcing the details of our \$400 million contribution in 2010-11.

CANADA – 2010 FAST-START CLIMATE CHANGE FINANCING

Canada's commitment to provide climate change financing reflects our support for the Copenhagen Accord, which represents a significant breakthrough in the global effort to address climate change.

As part of our commitment to provide our fair share of fast-start financing under the Copenhagen Accord, Canada is contributing \$400 million in new and additional climate change financing for the 2010-2011 fiscal year.

This financing will go towards supporting developing countries' efforts to reduce greenhouse gas emissions and adapt to the adverse impacts of climate change, with a focus on three priority areas – adaptation, clean energy, and forests and agriculture.

This investment of \$400 million represents Canada's largest ever contribution to support international efforts to address climate change. Combined with other committed contributions from the Government of Canada, the total amount of Canadian international public climate financing is projected to reach approximately \$441 million for the 2010/2011 fiscal year.

Canada is also contributing \$238.4 million over four years to the Global Environment Facility (GEF), the world's largest environmental fund, which marks an increase of 50% over Canada's contribution over the past four years. The additional \$18.5 million in annual financing will be drawn in 2010 from the \$400 million in fast-start financing.

ADAPTATION

Canada's fast-start financing for adaptation will go towards supporting the poorest and most vulnerable countries, including Least Developed Countries (LDCs), Small Island Developing States (SIDs), and countries in Africa. Our 2010/2011 adaptation financing package builds upon significant past contributions to adaptation efforts internationally, including our previous contribution of \$100 million to the World Bank's Pilot Program on Climate Resilience over 2008-2009.

- \$20 million will go to the Least Developed Countries Fund (LDCF) in support of urgent and priority adaptation needs of the poorest and most vulnerable countries in the world.
- ▶ \$10 million will go to the International Development Research Centre to build upon their innovative Climate Change Adaptation in Africa Program (CCAA). This support will be aimed at strengthening adaptation research centres in Africa.
- \$5 million will contribute to climate change adaptation

- initiatives in Haiti, working with current partners active in Haiti.
- \$7 million of Canada's fast-start financing will be added to bring Canada's total contribution to \$15 million in 2010/2011 for the world food program for adaptation and food security in Ethiopia. This builds upon the \$20 million that has already been committed over the past two years.
- \$3 million will support Vietnam's National Target Program on Climate Change.



CLEAN ENERGY

Canada will provide the International Finance Corporation (IFC), a member of the World Bank Group, with \$285.7 million to be used as concessional financing for a broad portfolio of clean energy projects in developing countries, as part of Canada's commitment to support mitigation efforts.

In addition, \$5.8 million will be provided as grant financing to support IFC's Advisory Services that will help remove barriers to private clean energy investment and build technical expertise. For example, advice will be provided to financial institutions in developing countries on how to improve energy efficiency and increase investments in renewable energy.

The investments are intended to leverage private financial flows for low-carbon investment and are aimed at getting a fast-start on the long-term financing goals in the Copenhagen Accord. Canada will work with the IFC to track the amount of private investment directly mobilized by Canadian public finance, as well as the emissions reductions achieved.

FORESTS


Reducing emissions from deforestation will lead to significant reductions in global greenhouse gas emissions and is a key priority outlined in the Copenhagen Accord.

\$40 million will go to the World Bank's Forest Carbon Partnership Facility's (FCPF) Readiness Fund which supports the building of national capacity to address deforestation and forest degradation in developing countries.

SMALL-SCALE PROJECTS AND ACTIVITIES

An additional \$5 million will be invested in small scale projects and activities in support of fast-start financing priorities, as well as to support participation by developing country representatives, particularly from LDCs, SIDS, and countries in Africa, in UNFCCC negotiations and related meetings and partnerships.

Hello Jeremy,

Have you heard about Toronto-based artist and environmental activist, Franke James, and/or the organization(s) with which she is affiliated? If so, can you offer some advice on how to respond to the request below? It concerns a proposal to organize a series of outreach visits by Ms Franke to Eastern and Southeastern Europe, Italy and the Middle East for the purpose of "Raising Awareness on Climate Change through Artistic Expression" - targetting primarily, but not exclusively, youth in those regions.

We had received a request for a financial contribution from a Zagreb, Croatia-based organization called "Nektarina Non Profit" some 2 weeks ago, and a follow-up message one week later from our mission in ZAGRB. A second message below from ZAGRB arrived this morning. "Nektarina" describes itself as "an international non-profit organization dedicated to educating, connecting and inspiring people to care about their communities and their environment". They list as their partners the following NGOs:

1. Earth Day Network (www.earthday.org) , based in USA

2. GCCA Global Campaign for Climate Action (www.gc-ca.org), based in Canada

3. TCKTCKTCK (public face of GCCA / http://tcktcktck.org), based in Canada

GCCA appears to be the most pertinent NGO - its secretariat is based in Montreal and has benefitted from Quebec Government support. It is also well-connected to other international NGOs, the most well-known of which are perhaps Greenpeace, WWF, Union of Concerned Scientists, OXFAM, Equiterre, US Climate Action Network and OIKOS/World Council of Churches.

Please find attached the budget breakdown, as well as some explanations of the costs as follows:

- Printing of the artwork Franke James artwork must be printed on a special type of paper (cotton paper)
- Freight shipping and insurance transport from country to country, and within a country to different cities. Insurance needs to be paid for each transfer, and the insurance of artwork is pretty expensive in this region.
- Framing of the artwork since the transport and insurance costs would be much higher if the artwork was be shipped framed from Canada and then transported from country to country, the artwork will be framed separately in each country where the exhibition will take place. In that way the costs will be reduced by more than 50%.
- Venue expenses since there will be 22 pieces of artwork exhibited, it would take a fairly large exhibition area allowing to follow the course of the exhibition.
- Press kits and press conference It is important for all the sponsors of the project to be presented and mentioned in media. Press conferences will be held for the openings of exhibitions and small replicas of Franke James' artwork will be printed on special paper and put in press kits.







Printing of the artwork - Franke James artwork must be printed on a special type of paper (cotton paper)

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Framing of the artwork - since the transport and insurance costs would be much higher if the artwork was be shipped framed from Canada and then transported from country to country, the artwork will be framed separately in each country where the exhibition will take place. In that way the costs will be reduced by more than 50%.

Venue expenses - since there will be 22 pieces of artwork exhibited, it would take a fairly large exhibition area allowing to follow the course of the exhibition.

INTRODUCTION

What is Climate Change? Climate change is one of the biggest issues facing the world today. 'Climate change refers to a change of climate which is attributed directly or indirectly to human activity that alters the composition of the global atmosphere and which is in addition to natural climate variability observed over comparable time periods.' *United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change*

ARTISTS AND CLIMATE CHANGE

From various media outlets' efforts to try to clarify and make relevant the climate change story, two points stand out. One involves the challenge of adequately addressing the nuances of science, making the story both scientifically rigorous and yet accessible. Please find attached the budget breakdown, as well as some explanations of the costs as follows:

Printing of the artwork - Franke James artwork must be printed on a special type of paper (cotton paper)

 Freight shipping and insurance - transport from country to country, and within a country to different cities. Insurance needs to be paid for each transfer, and the insurance of artwork is pretty expensive in this region.

 Framing of the artwork - since the transport and insurance costs would be much higher if the artwork was be shipped framed from Canada and then transported from country to country, the artwork will be framed separately in each country where the exhibition will take place. In that way the costs will be reduced by more than 50%.

Venue expenses - since there will be 22 pieces of artwork exhibited, it would take a fairly large exhibition area allowing to follow the course of the exhibition.

 Press kits and press conference - It is important for all the sponsors of the project to be presented and mentioned in media. Press conferences will be held for the openings of exhibitions and small replicas of Franke James' artwork will be printed on special paper and put in press kits.

 IT and Social Media - When Franke James is not present in the country where exhibition is to take place, she will give a speech live through video link for the opening of the exhibition

Print production - printing of billboards, brochures, posters, invitations and large boards with the sponsors' logos.

Other costs - all outsourced staff, such as an IT technician, people who will set up and dismantle the exhibition, etc.

Thanks Jeremy, appreciate the detailed response. However we have not been asked to provide funding for this event, as I noted in my message, we have been asked only for "moral support" - given that part of the exhibition features a Canadian, who appears to work extensively on climate change education and outreach in a reasonably balanced way - through authorizing the use of the Canada wordmark on publicity materials (and we would drop in on the event of course to see how it is being run). This event is "consciousness- raising" on carbon reduction at a personal level for teens through the "10:10Teen" initiative. Nor are we being asked to provide funding for Ms. James participation as the organizers are bringing only 20 pieces of her artwork for the event (but in fact I would hope that PIF funding could be applied to support for a Canadian speaker on climate change/sustainable develoopment issues, if Of course one of our choice, given this is a type of event we would look at organizing normally in order to present Canadian positions to our contacts) It would appear to me the event itself falls easily into the GoCs approach as you have described, if peripheral to our priorities for funding. Given no draw on funds is being considered, my question was rather related to the general outlook on the issue presented by Ms. James. Grateful to know if this additional information affects your advice as to the association with the event. Perhaps I should have emphasized this detail in my first message. Sorry for any confusion.

I hope you are well. Mark has asked me to get back to you on his behalf. We received similar queries on this from ROME and ZAGRB and have discussed with GLB. Bottom line: we would not/not recommend providing funding in this case.

I take this opportunity to share, <u>for your information/background only</u>, the following considerations, which are <u>not/not intended as material for a response</u> to the requester:

- funding has been provided to support climate-change related projects abroad to assist countries (in particular the most vulnerable) adapt to climate change;
- funding has also been targeted to facilitate other countries' substantive participation in international climate change negotiations within the UNFCCC.
- to my knowledge, we have focussed our funding at strengthening local capacity in other countries, and not/not towards Canadian speakers making presentations abroad on the subject of climate change;

As general guidance we would want to ensure that climate-change related support provided through departmental funds, while helping to address the challenge of climate change in tangible ways —in particular in those countries most vulnerable to its effects (including Small Island Developing States)—

MDC has concerns that the funding proposed would not be consistent with our interests and approach outlined above, and would in fact run counter to Canada's interests more broadly.

While the funding Canada has provided within the context of Fast-Start Climate Financing, is of a different order of magnitude, I am enclosing for reference the 2-pager that was issued last fall, announcing the details of our \$400 million contribution in 2010-11.

I hope this is helpful.

CANADA – 2010 FAST-START CLIMATE CHANGE FINANCING

Canada's commitment to provide climate change financing reflects our support for the Copenhagen Accord, which represents a significant breakthrough in the global effort to address climate change.

As part of our commitment to provide our fair share of fast-start financing under the Copenhagen Accord, Canada is contributing \$400 million in new and additional climate change financing for the 2010-2011 fiscal year.

This financing will go towards supporting developing countries' efforts to reduce greenhouse gas emissions and adapt to the adverse impacts of climate change, with a focus on three priority areas – adaptation, clean energy, and forests and agriculture.

This investment of \$400 million represents Canada's largest ever contribution to support international efforts to address climate change. Combined with other committed contributions from the Government of Canada, the total amount of Canadian international public climate financing is projected to reach approximately \$441 million for the 2010/2011 fiscal year.

Canada is also contributing \$238.4 million over four years to the Global Environment Facility (GEF), the world's largest environmental fund, which marks an increase of 50% over Canada's contribution over the past four years. The additional \$18.5 million in annual financing will be drawn in 2010 from the \$400 million in fast-start financing.

ADAPTATION

Canada's fast-start financing for adaptation will go towards supporting the poorest and most vulnerable countries, including Least Developed Countries (LDCs), Small Island Developing States (SIDs), and countries in Africa. Our 2010/2011 adaptation financing package builds upon significant past contributions to adaptation efforts internationally, including our previous contribution of \$100 million to the World Bank's Pilot Program on Climate Resilience over 2008-2009.

- \$20 million will go to the Least Developed Countries Fund (LDCF) in support of urgent and priority adaptation needs of the poorest and most vulnerable countries in the world.
- ▶ \$10 million will go to the International Development Research Centre to build upon their innovative Climate Change Adaptation in Africa Program (CCAA). This support will be aimed at strengthening adaptation research centres in Africa.
- \$5 million will contribute to climate change adaptation

- initiatives in Haiti, working with current partners active in Haiti.
- ▶ \$7 million of Canada's fast-start financing will be added to bring Canada's total contribution to \$15 million in 2010/2011 for the world food program for adaptation and food security in Ethiopia. This builds upon the \$20 million that has already been committed over the past two years.
- \$3 million will support Vietnam's National Target Program on Climate Change.

CLEAN ENERGY

Canada will provide the International Finance Corporation (IFC), a member of the World Bank Group, with \$285.7 million to be used as concessional financing for a broad portfolio of clean energy projects in developing countries, as part of Canada's commitment to support mitigation efforts.

In addition, \$5.8 million will be provided as grant financing to support IFC's Advisory Services that will help remove barriers to private clean energy investment and build technical expertise. For example, advice will be provided to financial institutions in developing countries on how to improve energy efficiency and increase investments in renewable energy.

The investments are intended to leverage private financial flows for low-carbon investment and are aimed at getting a fast-start on the long-term financing goals in the Copenhagen Accord. Canada will work with the IFC to track the amount of private investment directly mobilized by Canadian public finance, as well as the emissions reductions achieved.

FORESTS

Reducing emissions from deforestation will lead to significant reductions in global greenhouse gas emissions and is a key priority outlined in the Copenhagen Accord.

\$40 million will go to the World Bank's Forest Carbon Partnership Facility's (FCPF) Readiness Fund which supports the building of national capacity to address deforestation and forest degradation in developing countries.

SMALL-SCALE PROJECTS AND ACTIVITIES

An additional \$5 million will be invested in small scale projects and activities in support of fast-start financing priorities, as well as to support participation by developing country representatives, particularly from LDCs, SIDS, and countries in Africa, in UNFCCC negotiations and related meetings and partnerships.
